The Masonic Hall Association of Richmond (MHAR) has elected to close its facilities in compliance with the Contra Costa County Civil Order imposing restrictions on individuals and congregation thereof. As a regular client, you have indicated that your organization intends to comply with these same civil orders. Consequently, you have notified the MHAR of your intent to postpone your organizational meetings and use of MHAR faculties during the period of time civil restrictions are in effect.

Please be advise that you will not be charged for the facilities during the closure. Furthermore, you will be able to reschedule any special events that were postponed

during the restricted period to a future date, subject to availability and on a "first come, first served basis".

We are hopeful that the current situation improves quickly, reducing the risk to each of us. However, it remains uncertain that the current restrictions will end in May 2020. Therefore, please be advised that the MHAR will continue to abide by any and all civil restrictions until lifted by the appropriate authority. Furthermore, we will notify you when MHAR facilities will again be available for use.

In conclusion, we ask that you keep our Property Manager, Denise Matthews-Wright, informed of your organization's intentions regarding resumption of your meetings, at your earliest convenience, so as to avoid any confusion.

We thank you for your patience during these trying times and hope that your members remain healthy and happy.
