Relief and Community Service by the Fraternity

I'd like to highlight a couple of programs and projects that our Grand Lodge is actively pursuing.

Distressed Worthy Brother Relief Fund

First, I am proud to report on our charitable work during the quarantine. **The Distressed Worthy Brother Relief fund** has generated an unprecedented amount of Charity to help many of our brethren in need. Since late March, our Foundation has received more than \$400,000 from more than 2,300 gifts from members, lodges and individuals. This is the most successful annual fund appeal in our history, which underscores the urgency of the situation and the desire to help address the emergency needs of many members.

Masonic Assistance has distributed more than \$100,000 in cash grants to help brothers in distress due to the pandemic. We believe there will likely be a lot more need among our membership for this relief. As PGM and Chairman of the California Masonic Foundation John Heisner recently said, "our obligation as Masons is to care."

One reason that our fraternity has been able to get this new assistance program up and running so quickly is because the Masonic Outreach Services structure was already in place. As of today, Masonic Assistance has received 120 calls, 45 applications have been reviewed and 44 of those have been approved. As with many MOS inquiries, there are many requests for information about community-based resources to which MOS refers applicants. Job placement and assistance are increasingly being requested right now.

Super Summer Book Bag program

Raising A Reader's **Super Summer Book Bag program** is a new partnership with our four Major League Baseball partners that the Masons of California facilitated. Given the disruptive school year, our Foundation has brought together two of our trusted community partners this summer to provide age-appropriate summer learning kits for pre-K, K, and 1st graders. In late June/early July, we will distribute 6,500 kits to at-risk youth enrolled in our MLB community fund leagues, including the SF Giants. Our goal is to keep families engaged with top-rate learning materials for 5-weeks in July and August.

- SSBBs will supplement lost learning for the youngest learners ages 5-7, and
- 2. Mitts are still helping kids be active and have a fun summer!

The pandemic and subsequent quarantine have provided us with a rare opportunity to create an awesome summer enrichment experience for kids who are stuck at home, almost certainly without books to read. Raising a Reader will provide these Super Summer Book Bags with already approved funds committed by the California Masonic Foundation. The Giants Community Fund will handle distribution of the bags. Masons4Mitts Captains and our Public Schools Advisory Councils will help distribute the SSBBs in 5 regions in Northern California in July. Stay tuned!

As most of you are aware, the Shelter-In-Place order remains in affect for Contra Costa County and, consequently, our facilities remain closed in accordance with that Order.

However, the State and County are cautiously permitting the progressive reopening of facilities. We continue to monitor these actions so that we may prepare our facility and implement the mandated governmental changes. Reopening of our facilities is contingent upon the approval of and compliance with governmental agencies and our Grand Lodge.

As previously stated, you will not be charged for the facilities during the closure. Furthermore, you will be able to reschedule any special events that were postponed during the restricted period to a future date, subject to availability and on a "first come, first served basis".

We are hopeful that the current situation improves quickly, reducing the risk to each of us. However, it remains unclear when the current restrictions will be eased and or terminated as applicable to our facilities. Therefore, please be advised that the MHAR will continue to abide by any and all civil restrictions until lifted by the appropriate authority. Furthermore, we will notify you when MHAR facilities will again be available for use.

In conclusion, we ask that you keep our Property Manager, Denise Matthews Wright, informed of your organization's intentions regarding resumption of your meetings, at your earliest convenience, so as to avoid any confusion.

We thank you for your patience during these trying times and hope that your members remain healthy and happy.
