### History of Bay Cities Lodge No. 337

Carquinez Lodge No. 337 was chartered by the Grand Lodge of California, in 1899, just as the California Beet Sugar Company began producing sugar in Crockett, CA. It was the first Masonic lodge serving Western Contra Costa County. Two other lodges were chartered shortly afterward: McKinley Lodge of Richmond in 1902, and Pinole Lodge of Pinole in 1903. Over the next 52 years, 12 additional lodges would be chartered by the Grand Lodge of California to serve West Contra Costa and West Alameda Counties. By 2006, all fifteen lodges had become consolidated into Bay Cities Lodge No. 337. Our 333 active members include school administrators, businessmen, teachers, seafarers, factory workers, and medical personnel. The building we currently use was completed in 1970 with the expansion of the building to include a large public dining area and large lodge room. We meet on the first Tuesday of the month for Stated Meetings
